


She told her husband the wonderful news. Manoah prayed, "Oh my Lord . . . come to us again. Teach us what we shall do for the child."

very strong. One day he fought a young lion with his bare hands - and killed it!










Now the Philistines wanted revenge. Samson let himself be caught, tied up and handed over to be killed by the Philistines.







Philistine search parties looked for Samson. One night, they trapped him in a city and locked the city gates. But Samson walked out - carrying the city gates on his shoulders!






